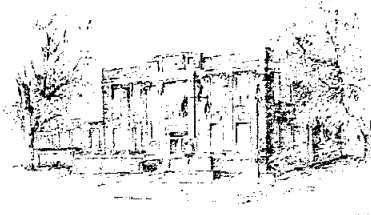

Ms. Jackson's stated that it had been estimated that for each person missed in the census count the County would lose \$1,000 of federal funding over a ten-year period.

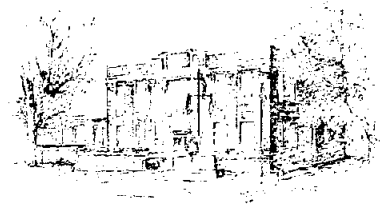
