The Macon County Board of Commissioners met, pursuant to notice at the Macon County Courthouse in Lafayette, Tennessee on March 15, 2021 at 6:30 pm. The meeting was called to order by Mayor/Chairman Steve Jones with Sheriff Mark Gammons opening the meeting. Commissioner Scott Cothron gave the invocation and Commissioner Kyle Petty led the pledge to the flag. County Clerk Connie B. Blackwell called the roll with 20 members present and by phone. Also made a part of the minutes is the Roll Call voting Proclamations and Resolutions.
